Older than 26 US states, Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) Pensacola is in its second century of service and is one of the oldest and most respected military medical facilities in the country. It continues to provide health care to over 150,000 beneficiaries in its main facility and 10 Branch Clinics in 5 states.

NMRTC Pensacola began its service in January 1826. President Adams assigned the first surgeon and officer in charge, Navy Surgeon Isaac Hulse, to establish a hospital at the Pensacola Navy Yard in support of the West Indies Squadron. Dr. Hulse established NMRTC Pensacola by renting a 2-story house as a temporary medical facility, for \$30 a month. Dr. Hulse would go on to spend 19 of his 33-year Navy career in Pensacola.

Although the establishment of NMRTC Pensacola was authorized in the 1811 Congressional Act which "...established navy hospitals..." a

permanent facility was not completed until 1834. The first hospital was completed, at a cost of nearly \$12,000; it was located about three-quarters of a mile from the Navy Yard on a 30-foot bluff. It was described as being 'outside the wall' of the Navy Yard. However, the hospital established its own wall, which can be seen today at Naval Air Station (NAS) Pensacola. It was a 12-foot-high brick façade enclosing the entire 15-acre compound. The wall was built so high as it was thought to keep mosquitoes out.

There are still signs of Navy medicine's past around current-day NAS Pensacola. Building 16 on NAS Pensacola was refurbished as the second Naval Hospital. It is among the sites on the base's tour and also believed to be 'haunted'. Hospitals 3 and 4 were erected on the original compound site. The walls of the compound can be seen today across the road from the Mustin Beach Officers' Club. Currently, the head-quarters of the Naval Education and Training Command (NETC), Building 628, was Naval Hospital No. 5. It was originally dedicated on 15 February 1941 and served as the main hospital until 1978.

Today, the 6th Naval Hospital building (NMRTC Pensacola) was the first to be built outside of NAS Pensacola proper. Initially commissioned as the Naval Regional Aerospace Medical Command, it was commissioned in 1978, and continues its mission of providing healthcare to America's heroes and their families throughout the Gulf Coast region. In 2001, the newest addition to NMRTC Pensacola was added: A 2-story, 73,000 square foot Outpatient Clinic. Among the clinics that have found new homes are Family Medicine; Obstetrics and Gynecology; Pharmacy; Ears, Nose and Throat; Dermatology; Ophthalmology; Audiology; Immunizations; plus the Medical Records department. More recently, the hospital completed renovation of all its inpatient areas and modernized "state of the art" operating rooms in 2010. Currently, NMRTC Pensacola is an outpatient surgical center with 10 Branch Health Clinics and one Annex spanning five states: Florida, Indiana, Louisiana, Mississippi and Tennessee. The hospital services over 150,000 beneficiaries with a staff of over 1,700 military and civilian personnel.



NMRTC Pensacola has a proud tradition of service. The staff fought yellow fever outbreaks in the early 19th century and endured to provide comfort during the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918. Seventy-three Commanding Officers and literally thousands of staff members have compassionately helped the ill and injured in all of America's struggles from the Civil War to the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. As a testament to this, in 1945, on VJ day, the hospital had a census of 1,073 patients. In 2003, the hospital manned and deployed Fleet Hospital 3 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, the first fleet hospital to be deployed to a combat zone. Since 2004, NMRTC Pensacola has repeatedly deployed over 10% of its military staff as individual augmentees in support of global operations. The quarterdeck honorably displays a bronzed pair of boots worn by Navy Seal, HMC Matthew J Bourgeois of Tallahassee, FL, who was killed in 2002 while conducting small unit training in a remote site in Afghanistan.

The Muddy Boots were originally awarded to NMRTC Pensacola by the Surgeon General of the Navy for its outstanding patient satisfaction and operational support in 2003. In the long campaigns that have followed, they are a steadfast symbol of our unwavering commitment to support and care for the hundreds of sailors from NMRTC Pensacola that have deployed as individual augmentees.

Not only has the Command supported America's warriors, but they have been key players in humanitarian assistance and disaster relief missions. They have supported the Gulf Coast region in responding to 9 major hurricanes since 1975 and have been crucial in support in the USNS Comfort's reoccurring "Continuing Promise" missions to impoverished nations. This included vigorous support to the victims during the Haiti Earthquake in 2010. NMRTC Pensacola is a fully deployable unit with more than 1,000 active duty personnel who could be called upon to support operational and humanitarian missions worldwide.

Since 1993, NMRTC Pensacola's unit awards include 4 Meritorious Unit Citations and 1 Humanitarian Service Medal. Additionally, the Command has been award the Navy Surgeon's General "Blue H" for Health Promotion and Wellness for 5 years straight, the Golden Anchor award for retention excellence (2010, 2011, 2021 and 2022), and won the Military Health System's Patient Safety Award. NMRTC Pensacola was also awarded the 2016 Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety Award from the Department of Defense. It was the fourth time NMRTC Pensacola earned the award since the inception of the award in 2003. The award recognized NMRTC Pensacola for its innovative hepatitis C program, which screened patients for the virus. Since the program was started in November 2015, more than 3,400 patients have been screened and 39 tested positive.

Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pensacola Commanding Officer Captain Alan B. Christian

Capt. Alan B. Christian was born in Baltimore, Maryland. Christian earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health Policy and Administration from Pennsylvania State University. Upon graduation, Christian worked as a healthcare administrator while he obtained his Master in Health Administration from St. Joseph's University. Christian reported to Officer Indoctrination School in Newport, Rhode Island, in April 1998. His first assignment was at Naval Hospital, Lemoore, California.



In March 2001, Christian reported aboard the USS Bataan (LHD 5), homeported in Norfolk, Virginia, where he served as the Medical Administration Officer. Christian earned his Surface Warfare Medical Department Officer qualification

and designation while deployed to support Operation Enduring Freedom during this assignment. Selected for duty under instruction, Christian attended the Naval Postgraduate School and the Navy War College in Monterey, California, where he earned a Master of Business Administration degree and completed his Joint Professional Military Education Phase One in June 2004. In July 2004, he reported to the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery, Washington, DC, where he served in the Comptroller/Resource Management (M8) Code as a Fiscal Officer in the Budget Division.

In December 2006, Christian reported to Naval Health Clinic, Quantico, Virginia, as the Head of Patient Administration and served as the acting Director for Administration. During this tour he served as the Medical Operations Officer for the 32nd Marine Corps Marathon and deployed to the Expeditionary Medical Facility, Kuwait, supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Following the deployment, Christian served as the Director for Administration, U.S. Naval Hospital Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. During this tour, he was selected for Commander for the fiscal year 2011 promotion cycle. Christian was then selected to serve as the Director for Administration, Naval Hospital Camp Pendleton, California.

In 2014, Christian was selected to serve as the Officer in Charge of Naval Branch Health Clinic, Diego Garcia, where he successfully led his unit through the Navy Inspector General and Medical Inspector General inspections and The Joint Commission survey.

Christian reported to Naval Medical Center San Diego as the Director for Administration in July 2015, and was selected for Captain during the fiscal year 2017 promotion cycle.

Christian's previous assignment was as Executive Officer of Naval Medical Center, Camp Lejeune.

Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pensacola Executive Officer Captain Grace L. Key

Captain Grace L. Key was born in San Diego, California. She attended the University of Pittsburgh School of Dental Medicine, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, graduating with a Doctor of Dental Medicine degree in 1997. After graduation from dental school and Officer Indoctrination School, Newport, Rhode Island in 1997, she reported to the Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD) residency at Naval Dental Center, Norfolk, Virginia.

Upon graduation from AEGD, Captain Key reported for duty at 3d Dental Battalion/U.S. Naval Dental Center, Okinawa, Japan as an Assistant Dental Officer at Camp Schwab Branch Dental Clinic in 1998. She was then assigned to 1st Dental Battalion/Naval Dental Center, Camp Pendleton, California as an Assistant Dental Officer and Division Officer at Del Mar Branch Dental Clinic in 1999.



In 2001, Captain Key reported for duty at National Naval Dental Center, Quantico, Virginia as an Assistant Dental Officer and Division Officer at Branch Dental Clinic Quantico. During this tour, she also served as the Annex Head at The Basic School Dental Clinic.

In 2003, Captain Key reported to the Naval Postgraduate Dental School, Bethesda, Maryland, where she completed an Advanced Clinical Program in Periodontics. Following completion of the program, she reported as the Periodontics Department Head at Branch Dental Clinic Quantico, Virginia in 2005.

In 2006, Captain Key reported to 2d Dental Battalion/Naval Dental Center, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina as the Periodontics Department Head and Division Officer at Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point Dental Clinic.

In 2009, Captain Key returned to 3d Dental Battalion/U.S. Naval Dental Center, Okinawa, Japan, where she served as the Clinic Director for the Camp Hansen and the Camp Schwab Branch Dental Clinics and provided the periodontics support for the Command's three Northern Branch Dental Clinics. She was then appointed as the Director of Clinical Services for 3d Dental Battalion/U.S. Naval Dental Center in 2013. In this capacity, she supervised the clinical operations for 12 geographically dispersed dental facilities and 400 personnel. In 2015, she was also appointed to be the Clinic Director for Evans Branch Dental Clinic (the Command's Flagship Clinic) in addition to her responsibilities as Director of Clinical Services.

In 2015, Captain Key reported to the Captain James A. Lovell Federal Health Care Center (FHCC), Great Lakes, Illinois, where she served as the Department Head and Periodontics Division Officer at Fisher Dental Clinic. She was then selected to be the Director for Dental Services at the FHCC in 2016. In this capacity, she supervised the clinical operations for five dental facilities and 410 personnel.

Captain Key's previous assignment was as the Executive Officer of 3d Dental Battalion/U.S. Naval Dental Center, Okinawa, Japan from 2019 to 2021.

Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pensacola Command Master Chief Dalton O. Trouth

Master Chief Trouth is a native of Manchester, Jamaica and a 1998 graduate of Evander Childs High School Bronx, New York. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy in August 1998 and completed basic training in Great Lakes, Illinois. He graduated in October 1998 from Airman Apprentice Training Great Lakes, Illinois.

His sea duty assignments include Fighter Squadron 211 (VF 211), Virginia Beach, Virginia, USS Anzio (CG 68) Norfolk, Virginia, Costal Riverine Group Two Detachment Bahrain, Manama Bahrain, USS Patriot (MCM 7) Sasebo Japan and USS Curtis Wilbur (DDG 54) Yokosuka Japan.



Trouth's shore duty assignments include Naval Air Station (NAS) Oceana Security Virginia Beach, Virginia, NAS Sigonella Security, Sicily Italy, Naval Station Everett Security, Everett, Washington and Navy Region Europe, Africa, Southwest Asia, Naples, Italy.

Trouth was selected into the Command Program in February 2018 and selected as Command Master Chief in September 2020. A graduate of the Senior Enlisted Academy class 212 (Purple), and the Command Master Chief/Chief of the Boat Course class 18120. Trouth holds a bachelor degree in Criminal Justice from St. Leo University and graduate degree from Liberty University in Crisis and Trauma Courseling.

In April 2022, he reported to the Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pensacola in Pensacola, Florida where he currently serves as the Command Master Chief.

His personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy-Marine Corps Commendation Medal (5), the Navy-Marine Corps Achievement Medal (3), Good Conduct Medal (5), and numerous unit, campaign, and service awards.

All single E4 and below Sailors shall not sign a lease until their BAH request is approved by the NAS Pensacola (NASP) base CO. NASP policy, IAW Navy policy, does not allow for unaccompanied E4s to live out-in-town when the occupancy rate is below 95%. This includes E4 over 4 years. The only exceptions are those members who are married, and certain financial hardship cases.



From Pensacola International Airport:


- 1. Head towards Airport exit


